



The Council, at its ordinary meeting held on 25<sup>th</sup> of June 2025, resolved as follows on the matters before it in respect of Section 29(1) of The Engineering Profession Act No 46 of 2000, which reads as follows;- *The Council must, after considering a report of the Investigating Committee in terms of section 28(2)(b) and (4), charge a Registered Person with improper conduct if the Council is convinced that sufficient grounds exist for a charge to be preferred against such a Registered Person.*

### **Case 1**

There is no prima facie evidence of improper conduct by the Registered Person, a Professional Engineering Technologist, and the Registered Person should not be charged.

### **Case 2**

Given the demise of the Registered Person, who was a Professional Engineer, and considering the due diligence conducted by the investigator, it is recommended that the investigation be terminated and no further action be pursued.

### **Case 3**

There is prima facie evidence of improper conduct by the Registered Person, a Professional Engineering Technician, and charge(s) must be preferred.

The Registered Person must be charged for contravening Rule 3.1(a), Rule 3.1(c), and Rule 4(a) of the Code of Conduct for Registered Persons, as well as Requirement 8.1 of the Overarching Code of Practice for the Performance of Engineering Work.

### **Case 4**

There is prima facie evidence of improper conduct by the Registered Person, a Professional Engineering Technologist, and charge(s) must be preferred.

The Registered Person must be charged for contravening Rule 3.1(a), Rule 3.2(j), Rule 3.3(a) and Rule 3.5(a) of the Code of Conduct for Registered Persons, as well as Requirements 8.4(a), 8.4(b) and 8.5 of the Overarching Code of Practice for the Performance of Engineering Work.

### **Case 5**

There is prima facie evidence of improper conduct by the Registered Person, a Candidate Engineer, and charge(s) must be preferred.

The Registered Person must be charged for contravening Rule 3.2 (c) and Rule 3.5 (a) of the Code of Conduct for Registered Persons.

### **Case 6**

There is no prima facie evidence of improper conduct by the Registered Person, a Professional Engineering Technologist, and the Registered Person should not be charged.

### **Case 7**

There is no prima facie evidence of improper conduct by the Registered Person, a Professional Engineering Technician, and the Registered Person should not be charged.
